1. Call to Order

Before we address the regular business of this meeting, I'd like to acknowledge that we are today gathered on the traditional territory of the Algonquin Anishinaabe, lands never ceded or surrendered in peace to the Crown of Canada. Indigenous peoples living under the modern colonial state of Canada have suffered disproportionate injustice and marginalization. A mere land acknowledgement is not enough to make reconciliation and reparation to the Indigenous peoples of Turtle Island. We must stand in solidarity against colonialism and remember our responsibility to the land and the peoples who have kept it for generations—which means affirming their call for the free and unencumbered return to their ancestral land. It is also fitting, for this body of lawmakers, to remember the spirit and wisdom of Indigenous governance models—from the collaborative bicameralism of the Haudenosaunee Confederacy to the consensus-based government of the Inuit—to deliver to students a better student union.

Proclamation of a Referendum on Millennium Promise (C-56)

Whereas, Carleton students in 2010 approved a levy fee to send funds to a charitable organization then called the Millennium Village Foundation; **And Whereas,** a full-time Carleton student currently pays \$3.00 per semester

to Millennium Village, later Millennium Promise;

And Whereas, Carleton students voted 78% in favour of removing the Millennium Promise ancillary fee levy in the 2023 CUSA General Election, however, voter turnout quorum was not hit;

And Whereas, the Finance, Fees, and Funds Committee voted unanimously in recommending that Council proclaim this referendum;

Be it resolved, that Council proclaims a referendum on the Millennium Promise levy fee during the 2024 CUSA General Election with the following question:

"Millennium Promise currently collects \$3.00 from every Carleton student per semester as an external ancillary fee group. Should this fee be removed or kept as part of the ancillary fees paid by Carleton students?"

And the options being:

REMOVE the Millennium Promise fee.



• KEEP the Millennium Promise fee.

Proclamation of a Referendum on the World Food Programme (C-57)

Whereas, Carleton students in 2012 approved a levy fee to send funds to the World Food Programme;



And Whereas, a full-time Carleton student currently pays \$1.29 per semester to the World Food Programme;

And Whereas, in the 2023 CUSA By-Election, students voted to implement a \$2.98 levy for the USC's Emergency Essentials Assistance Program to provide increased food assistance for Carleton undergraduate students;

And Whereas, the Finance, Fees, and Funds Committee voted unanimously in recommending that Council proclaim this referendum;

Be it resolved, that Council proclaims a referendum on the World Food Programme levy fee during the 2024 CUSA General Election with the following question:

"The World Food Programme currently collects \$1.29 from every Carleton student per semester as an external ancillary fee group. Should this fee be removed or kept as part of the ancillary fees paid by Carleton students?"

And the options being:

- REMOVE the World Food Programme fee.
- KEEP the World Food Programme fee.

Proclamation of a Referendum on the Clubs and Societies Levy (C-58)

Whereas, a full-time Carleton student currently pays \$4.21 per semester to the Clubs and Societies Levy;

And Whereas, the entirety of the Clubs and Societies levy is spent on direct grants to CUSA Clubs and the administration of such funds;

And Whereas, numerous Clubs, during the funding process, have noted that the current funding limit of \$2700 per academic year, limited by the current levy amount, is insufficient to fund their events and initiatives;

And Whereas, the number of certified CUSA clubs is increasing, with over 170 certified clubs as of December 2023;

And Whereas, in the fiscal year 2022/2023, there was a shortfall of \$29,293.72 in the club funding budget, and is projected to remain in a deficit



this fiscal year, thereby potentially necessitating a reduction in clubs funding next year;

And Whereas, an increase to the Clubs and Societies fund would allow for administrative improvements for clubs in banking, storage, response time and problem resolution, and would allow for an increase in the amount of funding clubs receive;

And Whereas, the Finance, Fees, and Funds Committee voted unanimously in recommending that Council proclaim this referendum;

Be it resolved, that Council proclaims a referendum on the Clubs and Societies levy fee during 2024 CUSA General Election with the following question:

"Carleton students currently pay \$4.21 per semester, indexed for inflation, in a Clubs and Societies levy which funds over 170 certified clubs on campus. Are you in favour of an increase of this fee by \$1.50?"

And the options being:

- YES, I support increasing the Clubs and Societies levy.
- NO, I do not support increasing the Clubs and Societies levy.

Proclamation of a Referendum on the Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion Levy (C-59)

Whereas, CUSA organizes and funds an assortment of initiatives related to equity, diversity and inclusion on campus through its campaigns such as Mosaic and Pop The Stigma, student life events, and programming;

And Whereas, a dedicated levy for equity, diversity, and inclusion would allow CUSA to bolster its services, programs, and campaigns on, but not limited to, mental health, international students, and cultural awareness;

And Whereas, the Finance, Fees, and Funds Committee voted unanimously in recommending that Council proclaim this referendum;

Be it resolved, that Council proclaims a referendum on the Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion levy fee during the 2024 CUSA General Election with the following question:

"CUSA currently delivers services, programs, and campaigns on mental health, international students, cultural awareness, and more in support of equity, diversity, and inclusion initiatives on campus. Do you support the creation of a \$2 levy per semester, indexed for inflation, to allow CUSA to enhance its initiatives promoting equity, diversity, and inclusion?"

And the options being:

- YES, I support the creation of an Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion levy.
- NO, I do not support the creation of an Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion levy.

Councillors vote by show of hands. 17 yays, 0 nays. Motion Passed.

Proclamation of a Referendum on the First-Year Transition Levy (C-60)

Whereas, only first-year students who choose to pay the \$135 + HST fee can participate in the university's fall orientation, or FROSH, programming; *And Whereas,* CUSA supplements the university's fall orientation programming with its own events such as Canal Games and Neon Carnival that are open to all first-year students, irrespective of whether they paid the university's fall orientation fee;

And Whereas, the \$135 + HST fee is a financial barrier for many students that prevents them from participating in fall orientation, with the notable exception of CUSA events;

And Whereas, a dedicated fee levy, paid only by first-year students, would allow CUSA to expand its first year events and programming during fall orientation and year-long;

And Whereas, the Finance, Fees, and Funds Committee voted unanimously in recommending that Council proclaim this referendum;

Be it resolved, that Council proclaims a referendum on the the first-year transition levy during the 2024 CUSA General Election with the following question:

"CUSA currently delivers dedicated programming for all first-year students, such as fall and winter orientation, that is separate from the University's fall orientation programming and fee. Do you support the



creation of a \$5 levy per semester, paid by first-year students only, to allow CUSA to enhance its programming for all first-year students?"

And the options being:

- YES, I support the creation of a first-year transition levy.
- NO, I do not support the creation of a first-year transition levy.
