### Results of CUSA General Election, 2024

**From date** Tuesday, February 6, 2024 9:00 AM **To date** Thursday, February 8, 2024 5:01 PM

Number of invitees24,746Number of valid responses4,900Invitee response rate19.8%

Notes on single transferrable votes:

- 1. Determine if 're-open nominations' has greater than 50% of the votes in the first round. If not, 're-open nominations' is eliminated. These votes are transferred to the next valid choice.
- Hare quota and fractional transfer are used throughout the counting process. Hare quota is calculated by dividing total valid votes by number of seats, rounded down to the nearest integer.
- 3. Because voters may not complete the full list of choices, some votes will be wasted in later rounds. In such cases where the total number of valid votes changes between rounds, the Hare quota will be recalculated.
- 4. The counting process ends when all seats are full, or the number of candidates still in the race equals the number of unfilled seats. In the latter case, all of the active candidates are elected.
